Board Briefs from School Board Meeting June 21, 2021

Board Briefs are a communication tool designed to highlight important conversations and decisions made on behalf of students, families, staff, and the larger community by the District 70 School Board at each monthly School Board meeting.

Student Recognition

Rockland fifth-grader Hailey Mulsoff was inspired to help her community bond during an isolating COVID-19 pandemic by offering movie nights. The students in Nate Baker's class read an article about how everyone -no matter your age- can make a difference. Students then wrote an essay about how they could make a difference in Libertyville.

"Hailey noticed the need for community events in Libertyville, especially through the pandemic," Mr. Baker said. "Hailey came up with the idea of a movie night in the park as a way the community could come together., She even wanted local vendors to sell food and drink at the event to increase their business in these tough times."

Hailey worked on her idea asynchronously with paraeducator Ms. Nikki Krissoff. She then worked with teacher Ms. Laura Williams to write a speech. Hailey gave her speech before the executive director of MainStreet Libertyville to persuade the organization to host outdoor movie nights as a way to bring people together safely during COVID-19.

Hailey's plan was comprehensive and included a reservation system, safety protocols, possible movies, and even food and drinks! Although Movie Night is not yet scheduled, Hailey continues to work to improve the idea and be an active member of the Libertyville community.

Math Curriculum Update

The Board of Education approved the purchase of Bridges (K-4) and enVision Mathematics (5th grade) math materials for the 2021-2022 school year. A May 17th presentation by Dr. Erik Youngman and Mrs. Jenny Parkhurst provided an overview of recent areas of focus and a materials review by the K-5 Math Committee.

Science Curriculum Update

Approval of Dreambox, STAR Assessment for One Year Each

The Board of Education approved the purchase of DreamBox for elementary students for one year as presented at the May 17, 2021 Board of Education meeting. Elementary students and teachers have used DreamBox for the past three school years to differentiate and personalize online math learning. Another one-year contract with DreamBox was recommended for 2021-2022 along with a review of the best available options for subsequent years.

The Board of Education approved the purchase of Renaissance STAR Assessments for K-8 students for one year as presented at the May 17, 2021 Board of Education meeting. Elementary students and teachers have used Renaissance STAR Assessments for the past six school years to assess reading and math for K-8 students. Another one-year contract with Renaissance STAR Assessments was recommended for 2021-2022 along with a review of the best available options for subsequent years.

Chief School Business officials Mike Adamczyk and John Herrin presented an overview of the Five Year Financial Projections for District 70.

This had been a process over several months, and aligns with District 70's goals of fiscal transparency. The five-year projections show the financial position of D70 and the impact of the expiring Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District, debt, fluctuations in revenue, and the impacts of COVID-19 on the long range fiscal solvency. Also, they announce that District 70's recent credit rating review from Standard & Poor's Global Ratings continues to boast a perfect "AAA" rating. This all shows a bright fiscal future for D70.
